Parish Office hours are Monday through Thursday 10:00 am to 3:00 pm and Friday from 9:00 to 11:00 am.


OFFICE HOURS FOR FR. CARLINO

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence. As a sign of our penance, we preserve for the Dio-PRAY FAST SHARE cese of Albany the custom of absti-

nence from meat on the Fridays of Lent. Abstinence binds all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Fasting binds all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Fasting refers to the quantity of food eaten. Traditionally, fasting calls for only one full meal per day. By retaining these traditions for our Diocese we do not intend that they be interpreted as laws binding under pain of sin, but as customs from which we will not hold ourselves lightly excused.

Human Concerns Committee

Again we will be participating in the 'Personal Care Closet' drive. This year we will be dividing the items collected between Catholic Charities (Schenectady office) and the SUSTAIN Ministry Program held at the First United Methodist Church located on State Street here in Schenectady. The clients both organizations serve live on fixed, limited incomes. Once basic needs are met, they have little or no money left for other necessary items such as personal care products, cleaning and laundry supplies. The 'Personal Care Closet' provides these types of items that cannot be purchased with food stamps and are not usually available through food pantries or other sources. We would like to help both these worthwhile programs. Some of the items needed are: bars of wrapped soap, shampoo, deodorant, razors, toilet paper, tissues, dish soap, laundry detergent, household cleaning products, toothpaste and toothbrushes, feminine pads/tampons, diapers (sizes 5 & 6), Pull ups all sizes (2T-5T), etc. We will be starting this drive the weekend of February 24/25 and ending March 18/19. Seniors must turn 65 years old before December 31, 2018.
