BLESSING OF THE FOOD

Fr. Carlino will be blessing Easter Foods on Holy Saturday, April 20th, 12:00 noon at St. John the Evangelist Church. The Blessing of the Food is a festive occasion. The three-part blessing prayers specifically address the various contents of the basket with special prayers for the meats, eggs, cakes and breads.



As a sign of our penance, we preserve for the Diocese of Albany the custom of abstinence from meat on the Fridays of Abstinence Lent. Abstinence binds all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Fasting

binds all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Fasting refers to the quantity of food eaten. Traditionally, fasting calls for only one full meal per day. By retaining these traditions for our Diocese we do not intend that they be interpreted as laws binding under pain of sin, but as customs from which we will not hold ourselves lightly excused.

It is a Easter gift to you from your parish to assist you as you journey through the next 50 days of the Easter season. We suggest you start with How to use the "Little White Book" and that for each of the next 50 days from **April 22**nd **through June 10th** you will take but six minutes to let God speak to you through the short Scripture passage and learn more about the customs, traditions and saints of our Catholic faith.
