Beginning Monday, **September 10**, 1:00 pm in Room 8, Sr. Joan will begin a discussion of *The Divine Dance: The Trinity and Your Transformation* by Richard Rohr with Mike Morrell. God is not what you think. Visions of an angry, distant, moral scorekeeper of a supernatural Santa Claus handing out cosmic lottery tickets to those who attend the right church or say the right prayer dominate our culture. For many others, God had become irrelevant or simply unbelievable.

This book points readers to an unlikely opening beyond this divinity impasse: the at-times forgotten, ancient mystery of the Trinity – God as utterly one, yet three. Drawing from Scripture, theology, and the deepest insights of mystics, philosophers, and sages throughout history, Fr. Rohr presents a compelling alternative to aloof and fairytale versions of God. ### FIRST THURSDAY BOOK GROUP

On **October 4**, 1:00 pm in Room 8 of St. John's Parish Center, Sr. Joan will meet to discuss the book *Lilac Girls* (based on a true story) by Martha Hall Kelly. New York socialite, Caroline Ferriday has her hands full with her post at the French Consulate, but on the eve of a fateful war, her world is forever changed when Hitler's army invades Poland in September 1939 – and then sets its sights on France.

An ocean away from Caroline, Kasia, a Polish teenager, senses her carefree youth disappearing as she is drawn into her role as courier for the underground resistance movement. In a tense atmosphere of watchful eyes and suspecting neighbors, one false move can have dire consequences.

For the ambitious young German doctor Herta Oberheuser, an ad for a government medical position seems her ticket out of a desolate life. Once hired, though, she finds herself trapped in a male-dominated realm of Nazi secrets and power. The lives of these three women are set on a collision course when the unthinkable happens and Kasia is sent to Ravensbruck, the notorious Nazi concentration camp for women. Their stories cross continents – from New York to Paris, Germany, and Poland – as Caroline and Kasia strive to bring justice to those whom history has forgotten.
