June 3 The Staircase – 95 minutes

Based on the real legend of the 'miraculous stairway' at the Sisters of Loretto Chapel in Santa Fe, New Mexico, *The Staircase* is an inspirational drama of hope and faith. Mother Madalyn's last wish is that her beloved but unfinished chapel will be completed. Sister Margaret would do anything to make this wish a reality. They need someone to build a staircase to the choir loft, but who will it be? One day a carpenter arrives and answers their prayers.

June 10 and 17 Mother Teresa – 115 minutes (each showing approximately one hour)

In a powerful portrayal, Olivia Hussey illuminates the life story of Mother Teresa, the selfless missionary who brought hope, love and salvation to the poorest of the poor.

June 24 Ocean of Mercy – 65 minutes

At the dawn of the 20th century, three voices rose up from Poland to proclaim an urgent message, a message powerful enough to alter the course of an age plunging into spiritual darkness. Filmed on location in more than 20 cities across Poland and the United States, this true story examines and chronicles the phenomenal lives and spiritual legacy of Saint Faustina Kowalkska, Saint Maximilian Kolbe, and Pope Saint John Paul II.

July 1 Full of Grace – 83 minutes

Mary is the one person in the gospel that had the experience of living thirty-three years with Jesus – from birth through His resurrection. After a full life with Him – fleeing into Egypt, losing Him in the temple and seeing Him placed upon the cross – Mary lives her final earthly days in reflection on how to live without Him on Earth.

July 8 and 15 Fatima – 1 hour and 53 minutes (each showing approximately one hour)

In 1917, outside the parish of Fatima, Portugal, a 10-year-old girl and her two younger cousins witness multiple visitations of the Virgin Mary, who tells them that only prayer and suffering will bring an end to WWI. Word of the sighting spreads across the country, inspiring religious pilgrims to flock to the site in hopes of witnessing a miracle.

July 22 Power In My Hands – 83 minutes

An all-star cast uncovers the beauty, timelessness and power of the prayer of the Rosary. The film will help viewers understand the power to transform individuals, families, communities, and instill a response for the need and the power of prayer.

July 29 and August 5 The Hiding Place – 145 minutes (each showing 1 hour and 20 minutes)

This is the inspiring true story of Holocaust survivor Corrie Ten Boom. During the WWII Nazi invasion of Holland, the Ten Boom family joins the underground resistance to help save persecuted Jewish families. But when they are arrested and imprisoned in concentration camps themselves, they're left with nothing to cling to but their faith.

August 12 and 26 Son of God – 138 minutes (each showing approximately 70 minutes each.)

The Son of God – the most important chapter of the Greatest Story Ever Told. The cast delivers a spectacular portrayal of Jesus as this powerful and inspirational film depicts the life of Christ from His humble birth through His teachings, crucifixion and ultimate resurrection.
